“Drink water from your own cistern, running water from your own well. Should your springs overflow in the streets, your streams of water in the public squares? Let them be yours alone, never to be shared with strangers. May your fountain be blessed, and may you rejoice in the wife of your youth. A loving doe, a graceful deer— may her breasts satisfy you always, may you ever be intoxicated with her love. Why, my son, be intoxicated with another man’s wife? Why embrace the bosom of a wayward woman?” Proverbs 5:15-20 NIV

The most intimate and intoxicating hug is the marital embrace which is meant for bonding and procreation. When a mom nurses a baby, she experiences a flood of oxytocin to bond. That same hormone gives each of us a feeling of trust and security to bond to someone during a hug. The flood of oxytocin in a male and female creates a bonding for monogamy that help people stay with their mates for life. Training one’s body to bond and separate with someone can damage the ability to bond for life long monogamy.

“To the woman he said, ‘I will make your pains in childbearing very severe; with painful labor you will give birth to children. Your desire will be for your husband, and he will rule over you.’” Genesis 3:16
NIV

Your reproductive system is only 50% of the system. You need someone of the opposite sex, your spouse, to complete your reproductive system.

Your body is beautifully and wonderfully made. Like the seasons of the year, your cycle is beautiful. Every month, your body prepares for a baby. There is a window of time in your cycle in which you are more amorous and you are more allured than the rest of the month. This is the time in which you are most fertile.

When a woman is on hormonal contraception, her natural pheromones are masked and her cycle is manipulated. Embrace the phases of your natural cycle and the beauty of your body as it entices, welcomes, and nourishes life every month.

There are viruses and infections that spread during intimate contact between two people that can permanently damage a young ladies ability to successfully carry a child or deliver a healthy child. Protect your body and pray for your husband, that any disadvantages that your children might have are not due to choices that you make and could have been prevented.

“Do you not know that your bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit, who is in you, whom you have received from God? You are not your own; you were bought at a price. Therefore honor God with your bodies.” I Corinthians 6:19-20 NIV

Over the last fifty years, viruses and infections have spread through the population that cause cancers and diseases that weaken the body from full health to the point of death. Terminal health threats caused through intimate contact include AIDS and cancer including but not limited to oral, esophageal, and cervical.

A woman's pregnancy history affects her chances of getting breast cancer. If she gives birth to every baby that she conceives, she is less likely to develop breast cancer in the future.

Avoiding risky behavior is a consistent public health message to encourage optimal health including avoid nicotine to reduce chance of lung, oral, and esophageal cancer.

“You, however, must teach what is appropriate to sound doctrine. Teach the older men to be temperate, worthy of respect, self-controlled, and sound in faith, in love and in endurance. Commit to the full time nurturing of the children and support of your husband when the time comes.

“Marriage should be honored by all, and the marriage bed kept pure, for God will judge the adulterer and all the sexually immoral.” Hebrews 13:4 NIV

The enemy seeks to corrupt the marriage bed because the marital embrace is precious to God and reveals God to each husband and wife. The temptations to defile the marriage bed are numerous.

Your husband is not an object. Pope John Paul II calls spouses to behold each other with “all the peace of the interior gaze.” To stare or to reduce any activity to an animalistic act is to dehumanize the person and miss the purpose of the union.

Every act unless by mistake of spillage should be consummated by insemination which is the providing and receiving of seed. All other acts are counterfeits and meant to mock the marital embrace. Dr. Miriam Grossman tells girls in her book “Sense and Sexuality” that the “rectum is an exit, not an entrance.” Each activity trains the body to respond to each other. Train your body and his for union.

“The husband should fulfill his marital duty to his wife, and likewise the wife to her husband. The wife does not have authority over her own body but yields it to her husband. In the same way, the husband does not have authority over his own body but yields it to his wife. Do not deprive each other except perhaps by mutual consent and for a time, so that you may devote yourselves to prayer. Then come together again so that Satan will not tempt you because of your lack of self-control. I say this as a concession, not as a command.” I Corinthians 7:3-6 NIV

You may feel like you need emotional intimacy from your husband in order to give physical intimacy. You will need to feel secure in provision and protected from harm. You will need to know he is with you and that he is honoring his covenant. You will desire to be chosen. Learn to articulate your needs and steward your desires towards your husband without over burdening him.

Support your husband in his mission to protect and provide. Honor your marriage vows and love deeply. Every marital embrace is a reconfirmation of the wedding vows. May your ‘yes’ be an ‘I do’ repeatedly.
